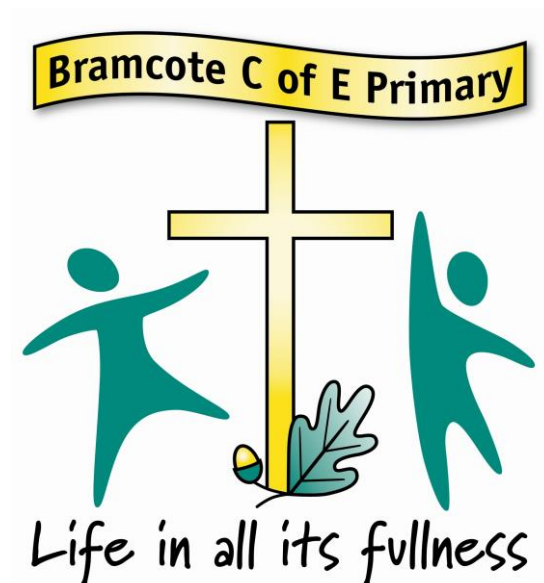

CHARGING AND REMISSIONS POLICY

GENERAL PRINCIPLES

The Governing Body of Bramcote C of E Primary School recognises the valuable contribution that a wide range of activities, including visits, visitors, residential experiences and clubs, can make towards all aspects of children's education. Accordingly, the Governing Body wishes to promote and provide as far as possible such activities as part of a broad and balanced curriculum for pupils attending the school.

1. ACTIVITIES IN SCHOOL

During the normal course of a school day, a parent would not be charged for any activity undertaken by their child. Nottinghamshire Local Authority makes it very clear that they are committed to free education for any school based activity which the school directly organises.

Consequently, after-school activities, where organised by members of staff, would not incur any charge at all. These would include art club, film club, football club, and lunch-time clubs such as recorder playing and chess. However, some clubs that are organised by external sports coaches and leaders they would need to cover their running costs.

An exception to this, in the case of instrumental music tuition, the cost of lessons will be charged directly to parents, but will be remitted in full where parents of a pupil are in receipt of income support or family credit. In these cases, the cost of tuition will be borne by Nottinghamshire County Council, if the child is recommended as eligible for the remission scheme.

2. OUT OF SCHOOL ACTIVITIES

Nothing in this policy statement precludes the School Governing Body from inviting parents to make voluntary contributions for the benefit of the school or in support of any school activity, whether during or outside school hours. Any contributions sought will be entirely voluntary and pupils will not be treated differently according to whether or not their parents make a contribution in response to any such invitation.

When organising educational visits we try to keep costs to a minimum, and ask parents to make voluntary contributions towards the expense incurred. Depending on the level of take-up, however, some trips may become less than viable where large sums of money are involved.

We have recently carried out an audit of educational visits to assist parents with budgeting. We now invite parents to make voluntary contributions of a set amount of money per term to help to cover the cost of educational visits and visitors.

Residential visits are different and by law, we are able to charge for the board and lodging element, but other costs such as transport and entrance fees etc, have to be met from voluntary contributions and other funding sources for example a donation by our "Friends" group.

3. Materials and Ingredients

A charge will only be made for any materials and ingredients relating to activities taking place during school hours where parents have indicated in advance a wish to own the finished product eg. cooking or design technology. Alternatively parents may be asked to volunteer to provide the ingredients and materials prior to the activity taking place.

4. CHARGING FOR DAMAGE

As a Governing Body we feel it only right to hold parents responsible for the cost of repairing any damage to the school or to its contents, which arises directly from the misbehaviour of a pupil. Our first school rule encourages children to respect the property of others, and sees this as an aspect of that policy.

REMISSIONS POLICY

The Governing Body recognises its responsibilities in providing for the complete remission of any board and lodging charges for those pupils whose parents are in receipt of Income Support or Family Credit, and who participate in a residential trip during school hours.

In the past most trips have been subsidised from school fund where children are obviously on Free Meals and parents are finding it hard to make a voluntary contribution, this will be at the discretion of the Head Teacher, who, know the families and could approach the matter in a sensitive and caring way.

All parents are advised of the situation regarding remission, and are invited to obtain an application form from the office should they be in receipt of Family Credit or Income Support.

This will enable them to advise the school of their wishes in order to complete the appropriate assessment of the true costs involved.

REVIEW

The School Governing Body reserves the right to review this policy annually and will amend this policy it as appropriate.
